HEARTLAND ADDS TWO MORE FM SIGNALS

The finishing 'touches' are being completed

Heartland received construction permits for two FM stations in January of 2018. These stations, known as FM translators will provide FM coverage for the Ashland and Eagle River markets.

The Ashland FM Station simulcasting WATW-AM went on the air Friday, November 8, 2019 and simulcasts the new "Classic Country" format of WATW 1400 AM at 101.3 on the FM dial. The new FM signal is

called "Bay Country" 101.3 FM & 1400 AM.

According to John Warren, Ashland Market General Manager, the new simulcast operation will program "Classic Country" or country music hits from the 60's to the 90's. Mike Wolf, Heartland Corporate Program Director and Operations Manager said, "This format was hand-picked for the Ashland/Superior-Duluth/Ironwood, MI market. We expect that it will reach many listeners. We have done our homework and this format is going to do well!"

The FM signal being added to the Eagle River AM station WERL, will simulcast the "Freedom Talk" format at 104.9 on the FM dial. "Freedom Talk 104.9 and 950 AM" features such iconic talk show hosts as Rush Limbaugh, Sean Hannity and Mark Levin.
